POLISH-SCOTTISH PHILOSOPHY WORKSHOP 2013

Warsaw, 6-7 September 2013

CALL FOR PAPERS

The Bednarowski Trust, University of Aberdeen, Scotland and the Institute of Philosophy, University of Warsaw, Poland are announcing the Polish-Scottish Philosophy Workshop 2013 for PhD students. The workshop offers 16 research students the opportunity to present their work in a collaborative and friendly atmosphere under the supervision of leading academics in their field. The workshop precedes a three-day Polish-Scottish Philosophy Conference 2013 with Wlodek Rabinowicz, John Skorupski and Tadeusz Szubka as keynote speakers. The themes of the workshop are Epistemology and Political Philosophy; it will be taught by four academics, each of whom will deliver a lecture:

Wlodek Rabinowicz • Lund University • *Safeguards of a Disunified Mind*

Jesper Kallestrup • University of Edinburgh • *Knowing from not Knowing*

Ben Sachs • University of St Andrews • *State of Nature Thought Experiments and the Distinctness of Morality and Political Philosophy*

Rafał Woniński • University of Warsaw • *Comparison of Philosophical Assumptions Among Liberal, Republican and Deliberative Models of Democratic State*

The organisers invite 12 Polish and 4 Scottish PhD students to participate in the workshop with a paper presentation. The presentation should not exceed 20 minutes and will be followed by a 10-minute discussion. 4 Polish and 4 Scottish students will be invited to give a paper at the conference. If you intend to present a paper at the workshop, please submit its abstract (up to 300 words) to conferenceUW2013@gmail.com by 10 June 2013. Please send another abstract if you are interested in delivering a presentation at the conference. You should only apply if you can attend both events in their entirety. The language of the workshop and conference is English. Notification of acceptance will be sent by 20 June 2013.

The workshop as well as the conference will take place on the University of Warsaw central campus (Krakowskie Przedmieście 26/28). No registration fee will be charged. If no alternative university funding can be obtained, The Bednarowski Trust will finance meals and reimburse travel expenses; accommodation expenses of some workshop and conference participants will be covered by the Institute of Philosophy, University of Warsaw.
