

The exhibition depicts Ludwig Wittgenstein's life and personal background, which led to the creation of the *Tractatus logico-philosophicus*. Photographs, excerpts from letters by Wittgenstein and his correspondents as well as commentaries by the exhibition organisers picture a person completely dedicated to the reflection on language and thought. The *Tractatus* is the culmination of an unusual mixture of these reflections combined with mediations of an existential nature and influenced by Wittgenstein's wartime experience and reading of Tolstoy.
