The Analytic Feminist Philosophy Society is a student organisation dedicated to feminist philosophy in the analytic tradition. Our goal for the academic year 2019/2020 is to study and popularise analytic feminist philosophy through a monthly reading group, open lectures by invited speakers, and public discussions. Among our interests are: feminist epistemology, feminist philosophy of language, feminist metaphysics and feminist philosophy of science, as well as the implementation of the methods of analytic philosophy to domains such as gender studies and queer theory. If you share feminist values, have an interest in analytic philosophy, and want to combine these in your academic work, join us!

At the heart of the Philosophy and Social Justice research group is the thought that some of the most pressing problems of our time—persistent social inequality and ecological collapse—are deeply intertwined in a way that is difficult to grasp and articulate within the mainstream conceptual practices at hand. If we (optimistically) grant philosophy the power to effectively scrutinise such practices, its methods seem to hold promise in helping us think through these problems on their own terms. The group comprises undergraduate and graduate students, faculty and independent researches who work on social justice broadly construed, including but not limited to epistemology, social and political philosophy, philosophy of science and law, as well as feminist theory and philosophy, in all periods and traditions.

In the academic year 2019/2020, we will be meeting for joint sessions, focusing on feminist philosophy.
